Let's Get Swapping in 2016!

PINK is the color for our April swap! Please drop your pink squares off at the back table when you come into the meeting and pick up last month's swap color which was green! Here's how it works. Each month you bring 5 inch squares (no selvedge edges please!), to swap in multiples of 5 different fabrics, pinned together and in a plastic sandwich bag with your name on it and the number of sets you are swapping.

Note: A great suggestion was made that it would be great to swap 2 of each color so that you can get back a pair of two of each fabric! Thinking about Pat Speth when you need a pair of the same fabrics in so many of her patterns! Great idea!

If this is what you want to do, put a note in your bag of squares and I will make sure you get pairs back!

Talkin' Turkey:

Monday, September 26, 2016.

\$50 for members.

Red strings combine with red and neutral scraps in this string pieced rendition of the traditional Turkey Tracks block! Update a traditional block with the freedom of string piecing. Instruction includes the ins and outs of the Easy Angle and Companion Angle rulers for easy half square triangles and flying geese units from matched pairs of strips, and foundation string piecing. Variety is the spice of the quilt!

\$50 for members.

This is a two-block quilt! A modified puss in the corner block, and an hour glass star block, both in 8" finished size. You can make this quilt as big or small as you would like depending on the number of blocks you make. This quilt uses 45 star blocks and 45 puss blocks. The 90 blocks are set 9 across by 10 down. Of course you can make the quilt smaller depending on the number of blocks you make

This quilt is perfect to learn how to use the specialty rulers I love and use so much in my scrap quilting! This is an exceptionally good class for beginning quilters, as we cover basic units like half square triangles, flying geese and hour-glass.

This workshop will be fun because she will teach up to 16 students and each will be allowed to customize and choose their own project. We should order her patterns through her because she will add fusible with the patterns printed on them. (This will allow us to speed up the assembly process.) These patterns and kits need to be paid for and ordered by the May meeting. Each student kit will be customized and will include fabric requirements as well as SOME preparation. 

As a result of our workshop, the cutting instructions have been tweaked slightly. Please discard any instructions which you picked up at the last meeting and use the revised instructions. Questions? Quilts of Valor – Block A


Fabrics needed:

- 5-3/4" square of red
- 5-3/4" square of blue
- (2) 5-1/4" squares of white on white

Make 2 half-square triangle blocks using the red and blue fabrics. Trim the block to 5-1/4" square. Lay out the squares with the red triangle in the upper right corner, and then sew a white square to the right side of one HST and the other to the left side of the other HST.



Join the two resulting units. Be sure to keep the units oriented with the red triangle as pictured.



The block will be slightly oversized. Please leave it that way so that we may use a trimming template to assure that all blocks fit together consistently.

Quilts of Valor – Block B


Fabrics needed:

- 10" square of light-weight muslin
- 2-1/2 x 14" strip of white on white
- Assorted red and blue strips of widths varying


from 1-1/2" to 2-1/2" wide

Lightly crease the white strip lengthwise and lay it diagonally on the muslin square. Center the strip so that the crease aligns with the points of the muslin corners. Pin to secure it in place.

Align a red strip on the edge of the white strip and sew. Align a blue strip on the other side of the white one and sew. Very important: Press the strips away from the center. Trim the ends a bit past the edge of the muslin. Add another red strip to the one previously sewn and a blue strip on the other side of the center unit. Press and rough trim after each addition until the whole muslin foundation is covered (Variation 1). You can also alternate the red and blue strips for added interest (Variation 2).

The block will have uneven edges and be slightly oversized. Please leave it that way as a trimming template will be used before joining the blocks to assure consistency.

Helping Hands Quilt Guild

We are a community and service minded organization our focus is to be "*Helping Hands*" within our community and to our members and their families in times of need. We look to our community for areas where our skill sets and position can be most useful and affective with positive and lasting results.

We do not have to look farther than the church and community where we meet every 4th Monday of the month-First Baptist Church. Every month the members of First Baptist Church open their Food Pantry doors to families in need. They provide basic foods that are easy to prepare and store.

Thanksgiving and Christmas are the special times they try to provide the most to as many as their pantry can provide. The holiday season is the hardest time they have trying to keep the level of supplies in the pantry necessary to sustain the number of individuals they wish to serve. In the other months they try to supply as many as possible without the holiday emphasis on special foods and desserts.

We can be "*Helping Hands*" with your contributions of:

- Dry goods-*rice, noodles, beans, cereals, dessert mixes, quick meals*
- Can goods-*vegetables, fruits, soups, simple meals in a can*
- Snack foods-*jelly, jams, peanut butter, Nutella*
- Holiday needs including all those things you use for your special holiday meals-*cranberry sauce, gravy in a jar, cake and pie fixings, and stuffing mixes, etc.*

The pantry coordinator needs sturdy bags with handles the recipients can use to take their selections from the pantry home without the bags breaking, hoping they will return with the bag on their next trip to the pantry.

We can be "*Helping Hands*" by creating many of these totes the size of medium grocery bags (general pantry bag size- 12"w x 14"h x 9 1/2"d) for basic supplies provided monthly and Holiday special bags (sized large enough to carry a turkey or ham and the fixings 18"w x 16"h x 8"d). In a future sit and sew we will create some of the tote bags. The pantry needs as many as you can begin to donate on your own. You may find that you have several strong bags you aren't using in your possession that you could donate immediately. We plan to put labels on our bags. Give your contribution to Geri Cohens-Headley to add our "*Helping Hands*" label.

The bags can be made from: orphan blocks; burlap; theme; scraps; salvage; canvas; upholstery; vinyl or any sturdy fabric. The pantry needs 25-30 large bags each holiday (Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter) and 10-20 medium bags every month.

We appreciate and thank you for your donations of any kind.

Your food pantry contributions continue as usual, place them in the box or on the table as you enter the church.



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
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
